SUMMARY REFERRED TO CONCERNING DISQUALIFICATION*

It is a criminal offence under the Act for anyone to be involved in the management or control of a Scottish Charity who:

- a) Has been convicted or an offence involving dishonesty
- b) Is an un-discharged bankrupt
- c) Has been removed by a court under the provisions of the 1990 Act from being concerned in the management of control of any body.
- d) Is subject to a disqualification under the Company Directors Act 1986.
- e) The disqualification provisions do not apply where a conviction has been spent by virtue of the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 or where the Lord Advocate had agreed to grant a waiver of disqualification.
- f) The penalty for the breach of the disqualification provisions is:
- g) On summary conviction, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding the statutory maximum or to both.
- h) On conviction on indictment, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years of to a fine or both.
